Of all the things that many of us find so remarkable about this young man, his fight and will to live through this disease have to be the most prominent.

Blake has continued to impress us on and away from the water. During his recovery, when many would insist they weren't ready, Blake returned his focus to his education and enrolled at The Ohio



State University. He has recently graduated from OSU's Law School. Several years ago, Blake also decided he would return to the river. First as a coach for Upper Arlington, and then as an athlete. Blake just competed in the Para Olympics in Rio and finished fourth with a personal best time, narrowly missing out on a bronze medal. The only thing we know for sure, is that Blake is not done being a leader and source of inspiration for our organization and it is an honor and privilege to assume the reigns of the event that bears his name.

Mike Rice and I are firmly committed to the Haxton Regatta along with the planning committee which is comprised of parent volunteers and long-time community members dedicated to the success of the regatta. We will ensure that the regatta continues on with the vision and care that has proceeded our leadership of the event. We will strive to make it the best event you attend this fall and that it does proper justice to the reputation of its namesake. We look forward to seeing you on October 29th.

We close by echoing the words of Chris Swartz: I am asking for your help as sponsors, participants, volunteers and spectators to make this one of the finest racing experiences you have attended. BLAKE HAXTON - OUR HONOREE

"I am excited to see the proceeds of this year's regatta go for the continued support of the Upper Arlington Crew program."

Blake Haxton was a rower on the UA crew team from the fall of 2005 through the spring of 2009 and was a captain for the boys' team from 2007-2009. In the spring of 2009 Haxton contracted necrotizing fasciitis, a rare flesh eating disease. He lost both his legs, and nearly his life.

After graduating from high school, Blake studied Finance at the Fisher College of Business at The Ohio State University. During college he took first place in the Men's Arms and Shoulders event at the 2014 C.R.A.S.H. B's in Boston. That same spring he competed at the World Championship Trials and won the chance to represent the United States at the 2014 World Championships in Amsterdam. He finished fourth in Amsterdam, and went on the represent the US in 2015 World Championships in Aiguebelette, France. He placed fifth in France and secured a seat for US at the 2016 Paralympic Games in Rio de Janeiro. On September 11th, Haxton placed fourth at the games in RIO. Following the games Haxton was selected as



the USRowing 2016 Male Athlete of the Year. This award is chosen among the athletes and coaches from the full senior national teams. In the case of this year, this includes both the Olympic and Paralympic crews. Haxton is the first male adaptive athlete to be honored as a USRowing Athlete of the year.

Blake holds a JD from the Moritz College of Law at The Ohio State University, and is an investment analyst for Diamond Hill Capital Management in Columbus, Ohio.

RACING FORMAT

- > 5K "Henley" Head race competition for high school age students in novice and varsity categories in 8's and 4's
- > 2 boats aligned rowing starts
- > Partially buoyed course with "protected water"
- > No "B" entries in the 1st and 2nd boat races
- > One dock site: one south of Fishinger Road Bridge for launch and take-out for high school crews (UA Crew docks). Plan for 40' to get to start line from docks.





SPECTATOR VIEWING

Races may be observed ONLY from the east side riverbanks and walks. Due to safety concerns from the police, no standing or observing of the races will be allowed from the Fishinger Road Bridge or from the private property along the west side riverbanks.

REGATTA PARKING



NO HIGH SCHOOL PARENT OR TEAM VEHICLES WILL BE PERMITTED NORTH OF THE FISHINGER ROAD BRIDGE.


The Columbus rowing community has assured the police and park representatives

that the park will not be damaged by the event, that the park will remain accessible to the public, and that lanes will be maintained for emergency vehicles, which will require that competitors and spectators comply with the traffic and parking plan described below.

Parking or driving on the grass is strictly prohibited. Cars parked in undesignated areas in the park, in the merchant lots, along Riverside Drive or on side streets may be ticketed and towed.

There will be UA Crew parent volunteers directing traffic. Please follow their instructions.

RACING VENUE



A SPECTATOR'S GUIDE TO WHAT YOU'LL SEE AND HEAR AT THE 2016 HAXTON INVITATIONAL REGATTA

The crew that's making it look easy is most likely the one doing the best job. While you're watching, look for – continuous, fluid motion of the rowers. The rowing motion shouldn't have a discernible end or beginning.

Synchronization. Rowers strive for perfect synchronization in the boat.

Clean catches of the oarblade. If you see a lot of splash, the oarblades aren't entering the water correctly. The catch should happen at the end of the recovery, when the hands are as far ahead of the rower as possible. Rowers who uncoil before they drop the oarblades are sacrificing speed and not getting a complete drive.

Even oarblade feathering. When the blades are brought out of the water, they should all move horizontally close to the water and at the same height. It's not easy, especially if the water is rough. The most consistent speed. Shells don't move like a car – they're slowest at the catch, quickest at the release. The good crews time the catch at just the right moment to maintain the speed of the shell.



Rowing looks graceful, elegant and sometimes effortless when it's done well. Don't be fooled. Rowers haven't been called the world's most physically-fit athletes for nothing. A 2,000-meter rowing race demands virtually everything a human being can physically bring to an athletic competition – aerobic ability, technical talent, exceptional mental discipline, ability to utilize oxygen efficiently and in huge amounts, balance, pain tolerance, and the ability to

continue to work when the body is demanding that you stop.

Race times can vary considerably depending upon the course and weather conditions. Tailwinds will improve times, while headwinds and crosswinds will hamper them.

If a crew "catches a crab," it means the oarblade has entered the water at an angle instead of perpendicularly. The oarblade gets caught under the surface and will slow or even stop a shell.

A "Power 10" is a call by the coxswain for 10 of the crew's best, most powerful strokes. Good coxswains read the course to know how many strokes remain for their crew to count down to the finish.


Crews are most easily identified by their oarblade design (see page 5).

It doesn't matter whether you win an Olympic medal or don't make the finals – each crew still carries their boat back to the rack.

Coxswains from first-place boats worldwide are thrown into the water by their crews.



A coxswain's job is to implement the coach's strategy during the race, in addition to steering and letting the rowers know where they stand in the race and what they need to do to win.



TYPES OF BOATS

Single - one rower with two oars (scull)

Double - two rowers, each with two oars (scull)

Quad - four rowers, each with two oars (scull)

Pair - two rowers, each with one oar (sweep)

Straight Four - four rowers, each with one oar (sweep)

Four With - four rowers, each with one oar and a coxswain (sweep)

Eight - eight rowers, each with one oar and a coxswain (sweep)

*In "scull" boats, rowers have 2 oars and in "sweep" boats or "shells" each rower has one oar

BOAT DIRECTIONS

Stern - the back end of the boat

Bow - the front end of the boat where the bow ball is located

Port - the left side of the boat

Starboard - the right side of the boat (from the coxswain's view)

Note: The coxswain always faces the direction the shell is going while the rowers face the rear






